Trametinib – MEKINIST®

What is MEKINIST®

Medicine Name	Description
Trametinib	0.5 mg pill: yellow, oval 2 mg pill: pink, round

How should you take your medicine?

Your doctor has determined your medicine dosage.

Swallow whole with a glass of water; do not crush, cut, chew, or dilute the pills.

At a set time, with a time interval between taking the medicine and eating (1 hour before a meal or 2 hours after a meal).

If you forgot to take a dose or in case of vomiting, do not take an additional dose but wait for the time to take the next dose.

How to get the medicine supply?

This medicine is available in local pharmacies.

Getting this medicine might take time. Be careful and order the medicine in advance. Store this product in its original packaging, away from sources of heat and moisture.

What else do you need to know?

Precautions and monitoring

Laboratory tests are necessary while taking your medication (blood test to monitor liver function), as well as clinical condition monitoring (blood pressure, cardiac scintigraphy, follow up with a dermatologist).

Using contraceptives

This drug may harm an unborn baby. During the entire treatment, you and your partner need to use effective contraception methods (condoms combined with another method).

Interactions with other medications and/or food

The occurrence of interactions between MEKINIST® and your other treatments may have harmful consequences (reduced drug efficacy and tolerance). It is important to tell your pharmacist and doctor about all medications and/or other substances (foods, plants, probiotics, essential oils, nutritional supplements, etc.) that you are taking.

Example: While taking MEKINIST®, it is necessary to avoid using ginkgo biloba, bitter orange, butcher's broom, licorice, yohimbine.

What are possible side effects?

Only the most common side effects are listed below. There might be some other side effects. For additional information, refer to your medicine leaflet or seek advice from your doctor or pharmacist.

SIDE EFFECTS



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	Skin problems: skin rash, acne, dryness, itching, hair loss
	Digestive problems: diarrhea, nausea, vomiting, constipation, abdominal pain, inflammation inside mouth (ulcers)
	General disorders: fatigue, limb swelling, fever, chills
	Pain: headaches, joint pain Eye problems: blurred vision, inflammation, pain
	Cardiovascular system problems: including elevated blood pressure, hemorrhage
	Respiratory problems: cough, shortness of breath
	Abnormal liver function tests
WHEN TO ALERT THE MEDI	
Tell medical personnel if the following conditions are	Hypertension symptoms > Headaches, buzzing in the ears, and/or dizziness
present and in the absence	> Blood pressure increase
of specific medical advice	Digestive problems
·	> Significant and/or rapid weight loss
	> Very frequent diarrhea, bowel movement over 4 times a day
	> Mouth pain or ulcers that prevent normal eating
	> Severe abdominal pain > Inability to drink for 24 hours and/or eat for about 48 hours
	> Bowel movements fewer than 3 times a week
	Symptoms suggestive of cardiac problems
	> Shortness of breath, lack of energy, dizziness
	Skin problems
	> Wart generation
	> Skin tenderness or a reddish bump on the skin that bleeds or does not heal
	Mole size or color change
	Symptoms suggestive of infection > Temperature > 38.5 °C
	Eye problems
	Pain in the eyes, tearing or redness, blurred vision, or light sensitivity
	Respiratory problems
	> Increasing constant cough or problems breathing
	Symptoms suggestive of hemorrhage
	> Blood in stool or in vomit
	> Hematomas (bruises), nose bleedings
	Symptoms suggestive of phlebitis > Red, warm to the touch, and painful calf
	Muscle disorders
	> Unusual and inexplicable pain in muscles
	Pain that prevents you from doing your normal activities
	> Headaches
